Scriptures

Mark 1:29-31 Now as soon as they had come out of the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. 30 But Simon's wife's mother lay sick with a fever, and they told Him about her at once. 31 So He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up, and immediately the fever left her. And she served them.

What a beautiful picture of our Redeemer. It is interesting that in Mark's gospel Peter's name is Simon. In both Matthew and Luke's account Peter is used. If you were to look up the meaning of the names in Mark's account you will see the gospel. Simon – the one who obeys. Andrew – the mighty one. James (Jacob in Hebrew) – supplant (replaces). John – the grace or mercy of God. Put those together and you get – The one who obeys is the mighty one who supplants with God's grace and mercy. Jesus is the mighty one who replaces with grace and mercy. Jesus is drawn to sickness and disease. Anytime he hears of someone who is sick he is on a mission to heal them. Where sin abounds grace abounds much more (Romans 5:20). Where the curse abounds God's redemption much more abounds

(Matthew 16:16-18

A fever is a curse (Deuteronomy 28:22).

The mighty one replaces the law with grace and mercy. The moment grace touched her hand the curse bowed its knee and departed. She immediately began to serve them. The fruit of grace touching your life is you become a great servant to all.
