The Man Born Blind

Course 13 Lesson 8

Scriptures

John 9:1-5 Now as Jesus passed by, He saw a man who was blind from birth. 2 And His disciples asked Him, saying, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" 3 Jesus answered, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but that the works of God should be revealed in him. 4 I must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work. 5 As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world."

Galatians 3:13 Christ took away the curse the law put on us. He changed places with us and put himself under that curse. It is written in the Scriptures, "Anyone whose body is displayed on a tree is cursed." NCV

Until then it is still the day. When Jesus walked this earth he was the light of the world. Now the church/believer is the lights of the world

John 9:6-7 When He had said these things, He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva; and He anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay. 7 And He said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which is translated, Sent). So he went and washed, and came back seeing.

Jesus spat on the ground and made clay. There is an Old Testament law that says, if a man suspects his wife of being unfaithful he is to bring her before the priest.

Numbers 5:17 The priest shall take holy water in an earthen vessel, and take some of the dust that is on the floor of the tabernacle and put it into the water.

The pool of Siloam in Greek is translated Sent. Go to the pool of the Sent One, or go to the words of the Sent One and wash off this curse. In the Hebrew the word of Siloam is spelled with three Hebrew letters—"Shin", "Lamed" and "Heh". Every Hebrew letter is represented with a picture. The letter "Shin" is the picture of a serpent. The letter "Lamed" is a picture of a whip. The letter "Heh" is a picture of an open window, which represents the grace of God. The pool of Siloam is a picture of a serpent whipped in grace. Jesus became the serpent on the pole (*John 3:14*).

Isaiah 53:4-5 Surely He has borne our griefs (sicknesses/diseases) And carried our sorrows (pains); Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God, and afflicted. 5 But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed.

Ephesians 5:26-27 that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, 27 that

He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish.

Proverbs 4:22 For they are life to those who find them, And health to all their flesh.

John 9:39-41 And Jesus said, "For judgment I have come into this world, that those who do not see may see, and that those who see may be made blind." 40 Then some of the Pharisees who were with Him heard these words, and said to Him, "Are we blind also?" 41 Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but now you say, 'We see.' Therefore your sin remains.
